
The club will shut down as usual in January for work and cleaning. The Club will be closed from January 15th – February 8th. If anyone has any questions please reach out and let me know how I can help.

There were lots of repairs and improvements made over the past season (to many to list here) and the grounds have never looked better thanks to the devotion and hard work of Ruth, Kevin and Jeremy.

Definitely the largest project for the year was being able to get the pool painted and re-opened after all the restrictions for the past year were lifted. We have purchased new heaters for the pools. This required digging and installing a new 2" gas line and now will require new underground wiring and new electrical boxes to meet current codes. Gas line work was completed in the early fall and the electrical work will be completed over the winter or early next spring.

Bell Canada has now installed fibreoptic lines all the way to the lighthouse and we have switched to them for our Internet service. This should be a substantial improvement for both the land and basin.


There were some great parties at the Point this summer with the highlight being the Smokn'Budha dinner party where over 100 were in attendance. If you missed it last year, make sure you come this year.




The Point Abino facility is now officially winterized and closed.

Merry Christmas, Happy Hanukkah, and have a great New Year.














# Love the BYC? Consider Joining a Committee
