Where did the summer go? It seems like we just opened the Porter Basin with its new floating docks, and now we are looking at it starting to empty out, with thoughts of how to winterize/store them.

When I last reported to you in July, we had hired a new Chef. Well, he only lasted two weeks before he walked out. Our Sous Chef, Mike Massey, stepped into the role of Interim Chef and the kitchen hasn't missed a beat. Thanks Mike.

In a related note, we have hired Denise Colletti, who will work with Sam in the dining room and for parties. Denise's primary focus will be on front of the house operations to enhance the Member dining experience.



The role will also handle Club functions, entertainment functions, and work with Members on private parties. Please welcome Denise as she greets you in the dining room.

The Board has been dealing with the issue of non-member vs. member revenue. The IRS has a 15% limit on the amount of non-member revenue we are allowed to have. This income generally comes from outside parties/banquets and reciprocal Club dining. Denise will be working closely with Sam and Mike Scheid to make sure we keep a close eye on the number,

so we do not exceed it.

The best way to make that happen is to increase our member revenue. Accordingly, please come and use your dinning room and Club, we have the best views in Buffalo and an excellent menu to make it worth the trip. In September, we had a Special Meeting wherein the Membership authorized the Board to contract for a new HVAC system in the Clubhouse. This will primarily be paid for with Covid funding because of the significant upgrade of indoor

They have done a great job and to keep this short – things that needed painting got painted, docks have all been stained, fixed docks are now out and stored and floaters will soon be stored and floated in center of basin as always. Due to Border restrictions there will not be a fall work party but not to worry, everything is under control.

We did have a bit of excitement this summer when some branches broke off the big tree and damaged the guard shack. Repairs have been made. About a week later one of the tall poplars (over 120 foot tall) fell and blocked Pt Abino Rd while damaging several of the brick pillars on both sides of the road. All repairs have been made and are barely visible.

We are in the process of taking down a couple of the trees threatening the kitchen and a couple of trees threatening the Bertie Boating Club building and having all the "deadwood" removed from the balance of the trees in order to prevent damage to the surrounding area while protecting the trees themselves from possible damage caused by falling / splitting branches.


In anticipation of the border and testing restrictions being relaxed next year we are looking into several other improvements for our facilities.

It was truly gratifying to hear all the complements conveyed to me this year on how nice the Basin looked. Those sentiments really are due to the efforts of both the Basin Committee and the Floating Dock Committee for it has been their efforts that has made this possible. new docks and berm upgrade have been a great foundation and starting point for all the smaller items that cumulatively made an impact. From painting the flag pole to new marine dock-carts, new umbrellas to new trash receptacles and new 'No Wake' signs that finally made an impact. It has been a delight to have the assistance of all my committee members. From my perspective it was also great to see all the activity in the Basin this year. However with everyone enjoying their boats and club the increased electrical demand identified that we still have some electrical issues on the Porter Avenue side of the basin that will need to be addressed. We are currently talking to several electrical contractors to obtain bids and plan to rectify these issues for next year. Going forward the floating dock committee will be working on secure

winterization of our assets that have to remain in the water over the winter and the Basin Committee is still working on completing the entrance bubbler system.

We also had a Junior Sailor Safety at Sea event this year at the Basin. It started with the visit to our Club by a transient doing a Great Lakes cruise from Long Island, in July the Club was host to Richard du Moulin. Mr. du Moulin has sailed in every major ocean race, competed in twenty five Newport to Bermuda races, has been on four Americans Cup campaigns, he is the past commodore to both The Larchmont Yacht Club & The Storm Trysail Club and served on the US Sailing Safety committee. While at our facility Richard offered to put on an impromptu Junior Safely at Sea seminar which was enthusiastically attended by all or Junior Sailors and their coaches. The event started with a video lecture and culminated with the very practical exercise of using a life sling. It was very reassuring to hear the kids raddle off the steps that one should take for a successful Man over Board recovery when asked as a recap at the end of the dav!








