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
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Vice Commodore Ted Johnson's comments:

After a couple of years of living in what seemed like a ghost town with only a dozen or so boats in the entire Point Abino basin, this year was different. Almost every slip was occupied! It was great to see all the people on the dock, at the pool, using the kitchens and the BBQ at the "Big House".

There were also a few great parties over the summer. First was the Smok'n Budah food truck evening along with live music with over 100 people in attendance. Thank you Ruth Sparks for all the arrangements. Then there was the "Full Moon" pot luck dinner on the turn around at the end of the berm with fresh corn supplied by Mike and Liz Jordan. And last but not least the pot luck dinner at the Big House over Labor Day weekend. It's a good thing we don't have pot luck dinners every weekend or I'd be more than slightly overweight! Thanks to all the great chefs and their fantastic dishes.

As many know, the heater for the hot tub had a melt down and needed replacing.

The pools were built to codes around 1983/84. In order to meet current codes, we had to install a new 2" gas line from the source to the pool house. A new heater for the hot tub as well as a heater for the baby pool were purchased and installed. Then, before we could get those hooked up, the large heater for the main pool decided to quit over Labor Day

weekend. A new heater has been ordered. Because we are replacing the main heater, we will also have to upgrade the wiring and electrical panels in the pool house to meet codes.

The Landscape Master plan adopted by the Point Abino Committee and approved by the Board is a threephase plan to be accomplished over the next three years has been put on hold due to the extensive renovations in the Buffalo Clubhouse and the high cost of the Basin Wall Project. The good news is it should be started as soon as funds are available.

Bicycle racks were placed near the pool and near the end of the north dock. We also used one of the "H" frames from the old "T" docks stored in the back yard as a kayak rack. All were well used and if we need it, another H is available for additional kayaks.

Railings were also added to the North docks to assist our members with the stairs to their docks.

Good news! Ma Bell has installed the new FIOS (fiber optics) lines past the Club. We will soon have the service available to us. So look for much needed, improved Wi-Fi at the Point next year.

As I write this, the season is rapidly winding down, most our boats are on the hard or have moved back to Buffalo. I would like to remind everyone the basin officially closes October 15th and all boats must be out by then.

Thanks to all who helped and participated this summer to make a great year at the Point.



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
